## The Wishing Well Appeal

- the international charity for the Sick Children's Hospital Howard has nominated for this year

Last year's two biggest fund-raisers for the RISK nominated charity have done it again and moreover, set an even bigger challenge to the rest of us.

Mark WILLIAMS whose band Peraguin Tyga still thrives, gave another gig at the Sportsman pub in Brownhills (W Midlands), this time decked out with official Wishing Well posters, stickers and collecting boxes, and raised more than £80. He hopes to add to this with a tour the band has lined up in local schools too.

And then there's Jackie STARKEY who, you may recall (enclosure note, RISK 11) raised over £100 in a sponsored 2-day fast last year. She aimed to beat that in both time and money this time, keeping a diary the while.

This is part of her account of 72 hours in the life of a working mum which she dedicated to fund-raising for the Sick Childrens' Hospital, Great Ormond St.

## FRIDAY 21 October - DAY ONE

**12.15am** Well, this is it - out for a meal with everyone: the big boss is leaving, so this is his treat. Refuse a second after-curry mint - it's gone midnight!!

1.35am Creep into bed: Mick surprises me - he's still awake! Well, it was foggy and he was worried about me driving home (with or without the influence of alcohol - I was without by the way!)

7.20am Awake with the sound of Hot FM blasting in my ears -wish they'd play more HoJo!! Quickly remember that my fast has started and wish I hadn't had the raw onion relish with those samosas last night. Get James and Paul's breakfast without looking: feel hungry already - it's all in the mind - have a herbal tea

8.10am Having lost all my tapes to Mick for his car, I decide to tape a few 'faves' to see me through my fast-DON'T ALWAYS LOOK AT THE RAIN, THINGS CAN ONLY GET BETTER, ASSAULT & BATTERY etc etc. Can't find blank tapes - Beethoven's SYMPHONY No 1 will have to go, sorry Mick - I need inspiration! ...well either I've forgotten to do something or the tape deck's not working, so give up the idea of music and fasting while I work (or take the CD player in to work!!)

**8.40am** Take James and Paul to child-minder: it's still very foggy and get to work by the skin of my teeth, nearly having merged Astras with a fellow commuter on the A508. Now for the second herbal tea of the day, and down to work (on a Friday, ha ha ha ha)

**10.15am** Ten hours have passed - so far that's £24.30 at the current rate of sponsorship!

10.30am Another herbal tea I think! Why is it that when you go out and eat more than usual in the evening you are more hungry than usual in the morning!! Mick phoned me to say he'd forgotten to tell me that Clifford called last night and is going to come over on Saturday to share a Perrier with me!

12.40pm Why is it I can't stop thinking about food?

**4.30pm** Just had another sponsor to add to the list - yippee!!

**5.00pm** It's not all in the mind anymore - it's definitely in the stomach, or not as the case maybe. Going home!

**5.05pm** Can't believe this - left my lights on this morning and I've got a flat battery! Phoned RAC - they'll be here as soon as they can. Great!

**6.15pm** Just got home with J & P: didn't have to wait too long for the RAC man after all. James and Paul are being very noisy and I'm feeling rather tired. Invite Laura for a cup of (herbal) tea - I need some support!

The usual traumas of the evening ensue: 'It's not fairhe bit me first!!' 'But I have had any sweets for *years*' 'I don't want to go to bed - I want to see Daddy' (Daddy isn't due home tonight till 10pm!!) Finally get them to bed - Laura's still here. That's what I like about Laura: she knows when to stay and she knows when to go.

**9.30pm** Settle into bed to watch 'Casualty', armed with a glass of Perrier. Mick comes home and eats his take-away kebab in private! Although I don't eat meat anymore, the smell of a hot kebab with chilli sauce is enough to get the gastric juices glowing!! Bury my head under the duvet and go to sleep.













#### SATURDAY - DAY TWO

**6.50am** Wake up with a feeling of immense guilt - *I* was dreaming of eating a bowl of tomato soup with onion bread!! Have a swig of Perrier and go back to sleep...

**9.30am** Better get up: feel OK, just a bit wobbly on the pins, but much better than last year's fast. Have a cup of herbal tea ('Early Morning' blend). Feed the cat (yuck!!). Sorry about the mess Clifford, but haven't the energy for a mega clean-up!

10.30am Clifford came for an hour or so, and so did Laura: we all sit chatting over glasses of Perrier.

12.45 Start to get lunch for Mick and the boys: start the soup and the French bread, but it gets too much, and have to go upstairs and lie down. Mick takes over - thank you my love!!

**1.30pm** Woken by the doorbell ringing - a lady to quote for double glazing. Make a drink - oh no! out of herbal tea - must go shopping! Out to Stony Stratford, dash in and out of the health food shop, trying not to breathe and smell all the goodies - this is crazy!! Browse about the Oxfam shop and the junk market: got no money with me anyway - but anything to pass the time!

**3.30pm** Get home, have some more herb tea (!) and watch a silly film

**4.15pm** Go to Laura's - Mick's cooking the tea, and I'm better out of the way - but get there to find her *inspecting a chocolate fudge cake!* I dive behind the breakfast bar out of sniffing distance! Stay and chat for a while then go home for a hot bath.

Jackie that evening goes to a previously arranged party (with large logo, sponsor form and collecting box), and manages to last out despite food seemingly EVERYWHERE...

**11.00pm** *Nearly two thirds of the way there now!* We decide to head for home: fall asleep in the car straight away, stumble out and into bed at home and continue to sleep till about 8.00am.













#### SUNDAY - DAY THREE

11am-ish Wake up again and lie thinking how I can collect some more money - and it comes to me in a flash, as they say - the village pub! Grab the phone and call the new landlord (bit of a cheek really as I never go in there now): introduce myself and explain what I'm doing - he says yes - brilliant! I ask a friend in the village and ask if she has an hour to spare to go with me to the pub. Incredibly she says yes without asking any questions: can't think why. She then hits me with the news that it's actually an hour later than I thought (the clocks have gone back overnight, from Summertime). Find this so absolutely hilarious, I roll about in the bed clutching the telephone, and send the cat flying! Mick thinks I'm delirious (can quite see what he means - Ed). Anne says she'll pick me up at 1pm and drive me the half mile to the pub: I'm feeling a bit shaky at the moment.

12.50pm Laura arrives and we count the money in the tin from last night - almost £13.00!

1.00pm At the pub: a good crowd there, and I'm OK if I lean on something or sit down, though I am feeling a little nauseous at the smell of the pub Sunday lunches. Laura and Anne are fantastic: they drag me round, telling everyone what I'm doing and why, and thrusting my collecting box under their noses and saying lots of thank-yous. After 20 mins I've had enough - the box is getting heavy and I've got a headache.

1.30pm At home, and we count up; there's £18 there!! Thank you indeed to the regulars of the Coffee Pot, Yardley Gobion!! Mick has given the boys some lunch, and we get then ready for a birthday party they've been invited to. I'm beginning to feel rather tense now; I sit down and stand up again, pace up and down and engage in much wringing of hands and gnashing of teeth. It's getting hard to settle and concentrate. I go to bed, read a little, and at last drop off to sleep...

**5.00pm** James and Paul land on me, and regale me with all the details of their afternoon. Mick calls them off and sends them down for dinner, though they're so full of cakes and crisps and fizzy drinks they don't want it. Thank you for trying anyway Mick!! I doze a little, then get up to help with bath-time.

**8.00pm** *Peace at last,* with the boys now in bed. Only 3 hours to go (the clocks have gone back, remember); the mental torture is far worse than the physical pain, I wouldn't have believed how hard it could be. I alternately watch the clock and the TV screen now (there's a weird film on), and plan what I'm going to eat when I hit the finish line!

10.30pm Go into the kitchen and prepare my meal: make 'sizzles', wash and slice a tomato and some mushrooms, crack an egg (free range of course), butter a slice of bread and open a tin of beans. Mick decides to join me, so I do it all again!!

11.15pm We sit down with our meal. Mick congratulates me - and then I'm afraid it's all just a blur of knife and fork!!













AND SO I DID IT!! - but only thanks to all my family, friends for their constant support and for putting up with all my agonies; Mick, Laura, Anne, especially - you are all wonderful friends.

PS I now HATE herbal tea!!

Jackie came to see us this week to hand over more than £240 which she had collected for the Wishing Well Appeal during those three days



















earlier this month we had a great turn out running for us in the Berlin Marathon.'
